

How do I sign up?

If you aren't enrolled in BadgerCare Plus yet, there are a few ways to sign up:

- Call the Enrollment Specialist at **1-800-291-2002** and ask for the *iCare* BadgerCare Plus program.

Who is eligible for the BadgerCare Plus Program?

- Parents and caretakers at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Pregnant women with incomes at or below 306% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Children (ages 17 and younger) with household incomes at or below 306% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Childless adults with incomes at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Transitional medical assistance individuals, also known as members on extensions, with incomes over 100 percent of the FPL.

iCare BadgerCare Plus Program

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What is iCare?

Independent Care Health Plan or iCare is a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) for the BadgerCare Plus program. We serve members in Brown, Door, Fond du Lac, Kenosha, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Marinette, Milwaukee, Outagamie, Ozaukee, Racine, Sheboygan, Walworth, Washington, Waukesha, Waupaca and Winnebago counties.



What is the BadgerCare Plus Program?

BadgerCare Plus is a State program that provides access to health care services for adults and children. It covers basic health care services, including primary and preventive care, as well as prescription drugs.

What services are covered by the BadgerCare Plus Program?

The BadgerCare Plus program covers:

- Ambulatory Surgery Centers

- Chiropractic services
- Dental
- Dialysis/kidney-related services
- Disposable medical supplies
- Doctor visits (office visits, surgical procedures, radiology and lab services)
- Prescription drugs
- Durable medical equipment
- Emergency ambulance rides
- Emergency room visits
- Flu shots
- Health screenings for children
- Hearing services
- Home health & hospice services
- Hospital services (including inpatient and outpatient visits)
- Mental health services
- Nursing home services
- Physical, occupational and speech therapy
- Podiatry
- Prenatal/Maternity care
- Reproductive Health and Family Planning services
- Private Duty Nursing and Personal Care
- Routine Vision services
- Substance abuse services by a physician
- Transportation for doctor's visits

These covered services may change. You should always check with your provider to

see if the service you want is covered and if there are any limits on that service. Some services covered under the BadgerCare Plus program will have a co-payment between \$0.50 and \$3.00. Co-payment amounts are based on income.

Nurse Advice Line

We offer a **24/7 Nurse Advice Line** staffed by registered nurses who are available to answer health questions and offer advice around the clock.

Mom and Baby Program

At iCare, we care about keeping you and your family healthy. The iCare for Mom and Baby program offers prenatal services, postpartum care, access to community resources, care for your baby, and additional support to meet your needs.

How do I get care or prescription drugs?

When you are accepted into the BadgerCare Plus program, you will be issued a Forward Health ID card. Always carry your card with



you. Show it every time you get care and when you get your prescriptions filled. You may have problems getting care or your medications if you do not have your card with you. You may receive a prescription from an iCare doctor, specialist or dentist. You can fill your prescription at any pharmacy that is a provider for the BadgerCare Plus program. You may have co-payments or limits on covered medications.
